Students will understand the implications of these areas for practice with children in educational and other applied settings.





DPE MEd Program Requirements

- Successful completion of 10 half courses:
- 2 required foundation courses (APD1200H & APD2293H)*;
- At least 4 electives from the <u>Department Electives List</u>;
- Up to 4 electives from the Department or outside of the Department*

Counselling Psychology in Global Mental Health field (CP GMH)

The Counselling Psychology in Global Mental Health will engage students in thinking about and addressing mental health problems internationally.

This program will provide students with an academically rigorous education and guided professional experience needed to contribute to mental health service development and delivery initiatives in diverse nations across the world.

Students will develop counselling/intervention skills and understanding for working with a range of mental health issues.





CP GMH Program Requirements

- This is a 1.5 year program
- 10 half courses
- First year consists of course work at OISE
- Second year (one term) consists of a practicum placement outside of Canada from September to December
- International practicum (250-hours in an approved public or private organization)
- NOTE: Students Need To Secure Their Own Practicum

Admission Requirements and Degree Equivalency

Minimum admission requirements for the DPE MEd and CP GMH program are:

- An appropriate honours bachelor's degree (4-year) equivalent to a University of <u>Toronto mid-B (for DPE MEd) and B+ (for CP GMH) or better</u> in the final year or over senior courses.
- Graduates of recognized academic institutions outside Canada should hold an appropriate bachelor's or master's degree or its equivalent as assessed by the University of Toronto.
- Use the <u>International Credentials Equivalencies</u> tool to see which international credentials are required for admission.

Supporting Documents

A complete application must include the following supporting documents:

- 1. Transcript from every post-secondary institution attended
- 2. Two Letters of reference
 - 1 Academic
 - 1 Professional
- 3. CV/Resume

English Language Proficiency

- As English is the primary language of instruction and communication at the University
 of Toronto, applicants must demonstrate an adequate level of proficiency in English,
 regardless of citizenship status or country of origin.
- It is important that applicants follow the School of Graduate Studies' policies on <u>English</u> <u>language proficiency and testing requirements</u>. We require minimum scores for all tests and Academic Division Social Sciences for TOEFL.
- Applicants from universities outside Canada where English is not the primary language
 of instruction must provide results of an English language proficiency examination as
 part of their application. Tests must have been taken within the last 24 months at the
 time of submission of their application.





TOEFL & IELTS Minimum Score Requirements

- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)
 - Paper-based Test and TWE: 5
 - Internet based test: Overall Score = 93, Writing/Speaking = 22
- International English Language Testing System (IELTS):
 Minimum required score: 7.0 (Academic) with at least 6.5 for each component.

Financial Considerations

- In 2021/2022, the international student fees were: \$39,620.00 plus \$2,525.99 incidental/ancillary fees per year.
- 2022/2023 academic year fees are to be determined.





Application Deadline

- Deadline to apply is:
 - For early decision: November 15, 2021 (5:00PM EST Toronto Time)
 - For late decision: March 1, 2022 (5:00PM EST Toronto Time)
- *Admission decisions will be made on first come first serve.
- After you apply:
 - Applications are reviewed: January/February
 - Offers are made: March June
